OPERATION UNITED S.T.O.P. FACT SHEET

The Tennessee Highway Patrol conducted the 24-hour Operation United S.T.O.P. enforcement campaign on October 14, 2009.

Statewide results from Operation United S.T.O.P. at eight sites across the state:

- State Troopers issued 1,838 citations for both moving and non-moving violations.
 - A total of 674 moving violations (speeding, DUI, reckless driving, etc.) were issued, 505 of which were commercial vehicle violations.
 - A total of 1,164 non-moving violations (safety restraint, drive license, revoked driver license, etc) were issued, 97 of which were commercial vehicle violations.
- State Troopers conducted a total of 1,151 commercial vehicle inspections.
- A total of 67 commercial vehicles were placed out-of-service for violations.
- A total of 59 commercial vehicles drivers were placed out-of-service for violations.
- State Troopers worked a total of 3,546 enforcement hours during Operation United S.T.O.P.

General Facts on Tennessee Interstates & Highways:

- Tennessee is less than a day's drive from three-quarters of the U.S. population.
- There are 11 interstates in Tennessee: I-24, I-26, I-40, I-55, I-65, I-75, I-81, I-155, I-240, I-440, and I-640.
- Approximately 27% of all interstate traffic in Tennessee is commercial vehicle traffic.
- Approximately 10% of all traffic in Tennessee is commercial vehicle traffic.
